As of 25th May 2018, businesses will need to demonstrate their compliance with GDPR by keeping an accurate and up-to-date record of how they process data and make this information readily available to the supervisory authority upon request These records will need to show how, what, where and why the data is processed

GDPR for Employers

The GDPR introduces a new mandatory obligation requiring employers to notify data breaches to the Data Protection Commission (DPC) "without undue delay, and where feasible, not later than 72 hours after having become aware of it" If notification is not made after 72 hours, a reasoned justification for the delay must be provided
